Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport to Host Job Fair

Dozens of area employers looking to fill more than 1,000 jobs

ATLANTA- Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) will host its first job fair of 2017 Thursday, March 30. More than 60 employers will be on hand hoping to fill more than 1,000 positions. This will be the sixth job fair ATL has held since 2010, hosting more than 16,000 candidates.

Positions as varied as baristas and baggage handlers to carpenters and cashiers will be available, as well as professional jobs such as engineers and budget analysts. The free event, held at the Georgia International Convention Center (GICC), is the perfect opportunity for qualified individuals to apply for jobs with Airport concessionaires and employers engaged in the multibillion-dollar capital improvement program, ATLNext.

Companies will interview potential employees on the spot, so all attendees should dress in proper business attire and bring at least 10 resumes.

On-site parking is \$5, but space is limited. Organizers encourage attendees to take MARTA to the Airport, and then transfer to the free SkyTrain, which provides direct service to the GICC.
