Hartsfield-Jackson Celebrates Earth Day with GreeningATL Excellence Awards, Sustainability Priority Update, Passenger Participation Event

ATL continues efforts to become the greenest airport in the world

ATLANTA – Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) officials will mark Earth Day with a series of events Thursday, April 21 and Friday, April 22. The celebrations begin with the annual GreeningATL Excellence Awards luncheon Thursday. The awards were created to recognize ATL stakeholders that have demonstrated outstanding leadership by promoting and implementing sustainability measures while doing business at ATL. This year's nominees include Delta Air Lines for its energy conservation and efficiency efforts; Mack II Inc. for its leadership role in ATL's Sustainable Food Court Initiative; Concessions International for its work with the local community in pursuing environmental improvements; Georgia Tech for continued innovation in the field of sustainability; and American Rivers for its leadership role in enhancing the long-term sustainability of ATL's natural environment.

Stephanie Stuckey Benfield, director of the Mayor's Office of Sustainability, will deliver the luncheon's keynote address. Aviation General Manager Miguel Southwell will discuss ATL's efforts to ensure the world's most traveled airport also becomes the world's greenest airport.

The festivities will continue Friday, April 22, when ATL hosts the Passenger Earth Day Celebration in the Domestic Terminal Atrium. The event will feature live music, environmentally friendly gifts, coloring books and crafts for children, and a 10-foot globe, which will be on display throughout the day.

- Installed building management systems at all terminals for maximum HVAC energy efficiency
- Received an EPA Clean Water Act grant to incorporate green infrastructure into projects

- Created AERO (Airport Employee Ride Options), a transportation management association to reduce employee single-occupancy vehicle miles

- 1st major hub airport to upgrade airfield lighting to 100 percent LED
- Ist airport to form an Airport Eco-District
- Ist airport to initiate an airport-wide incentive program to control airborne grease

- 1st airport in the United States to be certified through the International Organization for Standardization in energy management (ISO 50001)
- Ist airport to receive a Zero Emissions Vehicle FAA grant for the terminal-to-terminal electric shuttle bus

Hartsfield-Jackson (ATL) is the world's most traveled and most efficient airport, serving more than 101 million passengers annually with nonstop service to more than 150 U.S. destinations and nearly 70 international destinations in more than 45 countries. ATL boasts a direct economic impact of \$34.8 billion in metro Atlanta and a total direct economic impact of \$70.9 billion in Georgia. The Airport is the largest employer in Georgia, with more than 63,000 employees.
