ATL Next Construction to Have Slight Impact on Traffic This Week

ATLANTA – As part of the ongoing ATL Next construction efforts at Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL), traffic will be halted for a brief period just before noon on Tuesday, Aug. 16, Thursday, Aug. 18 and Saturday, Aug. 20. The delay is scheduled to allow additional clearing of the commercial vehicle lot between Terminal Parkway and the Old South Terminal Parkway. On all three days at noon, Atlanta police officers will halt traffic southbound at Airport Boulevard and northbound at Terminal Parkway. The delays are expected to last no more than 10 minutes. ATL Next is the \$6 billion dollar capital improvement plan that will modernize ATL's domestic terminal and concourses, construct a new terminal and 300-room hotel, add a new runway, expand and replace parking decks, and maintain ATL's position as the world leader in air travel for the decades ahead.
