Hartsfield-Jackson Celebrates Pianos for Peace Festival

Closing ceremony to feature music, special announcement

ATLANTA – Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) officials will close the inaugural Pianos for Peace Festival in musical fashion Friday, Sept. 30 in the Airport's Domestic Terminal Atrium. The project, which placed 29 pianos in public spaces across metro Atlanta, was the brainchild of Malek Jandali, a Syrian native who has seen firsthand the effects of war. Jandali hoped to use the Pianos for Peace Festival to bring people together by allowing anyone to play the instruments in heavily trafficked locations across the city. During the month-long festival, musicians of all skillsets sat down at the ATL pianos, placed in both the Domestic and International terminals, to perform for travelers making their way through the world's busiest airport.

Friday's event will feature performances from professional musicians, the young daughter of an artist commissioned to paint one of the pianos used in the festival, and two area school musical groups. Officials will also announce which local schools have received pianos donated by festival organizers.
