ATLANTA – Registration is open for ATLThinks!, an incubator program designed to highlight metro Atlanta's innovative individuals and companies through a series of ideation labs, hackathons and pitch competitions. The spring 2017 edition will feature entrepreneurs and engineers, students and instructors, and experts and novices working on aviation-focused projects that will impact the airport of the future.

Three divisions of participants (college students, professionals and startups less than 3 years old) will work to solve challenges faced by airports around the world. The winning team from each division will deploy its solution with Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) and retain the intellectual property for future use.

A dramatic pitch competition May 24 will determine the winners.
