## Hartsfield-Jackson Named Most Efficient Airport for 14<sup>th</sup> Consecutive Year ATL bests 200 other airports in international study

**ATLANTA** – For the 14<sup>th</sup> straight year, Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) was honored with an Efficiency Excellence Award from the Air Transport Research Society (ATRS). Over the weekend, ATRS released its annual benchmarking study of commercial airports in North America, Europe, Asia and Oceania, assessing the productivity and efficiency of nearly 200 airports based on airport cost and revenue data.

"This award recognizes the efforts put forward by all involved at Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport," said Airport General Manager Roosevelt Council, Jr. "We are honored for the recognition and grateful to our airline partners and employees for their hard work as we continue to strive for excellence in all aspects of ATL's operations."
