Hartsfield-Jackson Provides Tour of Service Animal Relief Area

Completion of all relief areas eases travel for passengers, pets

ATLANTA – Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL) officials will host a tour of the F Concourse service animal relief area Thursday, Aug. 24. This is one of nine pet relief areas located throughout the world's busiest airport.

In 2016, federal law mandated pet relief areas for service animals that accompany passengers departing, connecting or arriving at large airports. ATL previously constructed animal relief areas outside of the Domestic and International terminals, but now features service animal relief areas on every concourse post-security. These much-needed facilities not only provide pet comfort, but increase the quality of the passenger experience at ATL.
