PRACTICE THESE 4 P's OF SECURITY TO PROTECT THE SECURITY POSTURE OF THE AIRPORT

Properly Display ATL Identification (ID) Badge- Employees are responsible for challenging anyone they see without an ATL Badge or an ATL-approved ID display while in the restricted areas of the Airport. Please ensure your ATL SIDA Badge is displayed on the outermost garment between the shoulder and waistline.

Prevent Unauthorized Access – All ATL SIDA badge holders must ensure that doors (including elevators) and vehicle gates are closed and secured after each use to prevent unauthorized access. Immediately report any suspicious activity or observation of unauthorized person(s) to law enforcement or an Airport authority.

Prevent Piggybacking – It is everyone's responsibility to prevent unauthorized access whether on foot or in a vehicle. Do not let unauthorized persons gain access through a door, gate, or elevator utilizing your authorized access (with or without your knowledge).

Prohibited Items - Attempting to and/or bringing prohibited items into the Sterile, Secure, or SIDA Areas of the Airport will result in immediate badge suspension and potentially fines from TSA. Violators may also be subject to arrest. Please ensure you are not in possession of these items and report others that may attempt or be in possession of prohibited items in the restricted areas.
