Airport Curbside Parking/Illegal Rideshare Solicitation

- The ATL Enforcement department and APD are responsible for the safety and security of the world's busiest airport, and it starts on the terminal curbsides.
- Please make sure that all vehicles on the curb are permitted and decal'd through the airport so that the vehicles can be easily identified.
- Any vehicle that fails to comply with the city code will be cited and towed off airport property.
- Use of Airport Security Identification badges and company uniforms in the windshield as a form of parking permit is strictly prohibited.
- All vendors should have the proper authorization to park vehicles curbside prior to arrival
- If an unattended or suspicious vehicle is observed on the terminal roadways and curbs sides, please notify the 911 dispatch center immediately.
- If illegal Rideshare solicitation is observed in the airport terminals and parking areas, please notify airport law enforcement immediately.
- Airport employees are prohibited from assisting solicitation activities
- Companies and/or employees violating this directive will result in the loss of access privileges, fines and/or prosecution.
