### Escorting Policy

All escorting requests must be submitted with a minimum of 24 hours' advance notice for approval. Please note the following key points:

- Escort Request <https://apps.iflyatl.com/ASERRT>
- The maximum number of individuals that can be escorted is five (5).
- Individuals cannot be escorted for more than 72 hours within a 12-month period.
- DOA Security retains the authority to modify or revoke the escort authorization if any violations are found during the escort period.
- Note: If an escorted person engages in activities other than those for which access was granted, the person providing the escort is required to maintain watch if possible and report the incident to Airport police by calling 911 immediately.
